## PAST

SIMPLE

Infinitive + -ed / 2nd form

I/you/we/they worked/went.  
He/she/it worked/went.

Yesterday, last week,  
3 days ago, in 1990,  
when I was young



CONTINUOUS

Was / Were + infinitive + - ing

I/he/she/it was working.  
You/we/they were working.

All day yesterday, yesterday  
at 3 o'clock, from 2 to 4,  
last Sunday, 3 days ago,  
While..., When...,

## PRESENT

SIMPLE

Infinitive / -s

I/you/we/they work.  
He/she/it works.

Every day, sometimes, always,  
usually, never, twice a week,  
often, rarely, seldom,  
on Fridays



CONTINUOUS

Am / is / are  
+ infinitive + - ing

I am/you/we/they  
are working.  
He/she/it is working.

Now, today, at present,  
tonight, at the moment



PLAČUJMO DAVKE DOBRE VOLJE,  
DA BODO UČILNICE LAHKO  
OPREMLJENE ŠE BOLJE.



PRORAČUN PLAČUJE RAZISKAVE,  
KI PROUČUJEJO ELEKTROMAGNETNO POLJE,  
ZNANSTVENIKE BRIHTNE GLAVE,  
KI NAS BODO POPELJALI V VESOLJE.



## FUTURE

SIMPLE

Will / shall + infinitive

I/you/we/they will work.  
He/she/it will work.

Next month, tomorrow,  
in 5 days, in the year 2020



CONTINUOUS

Will / shall + be +  
infinitive + - ing

I/you/we/they will be  
working.  
He/she/it will be working.

Next month, tomorrow at 3  
o'clock, in 5 days, in the year  
2020, next 10 minutes,  
from...to tomorrow



Am / is / are + going to +  
infinitive

I am/you/we/they are going  
to work.  
He/she/it is going to work.

Soon, on Sunday, next week,  
tomorrow, in 5 days,  
in the year 2020



## PAST PERFECT

SIMPLE

Had + p.p.

I/you/we/they had  
worked/gone.  
He/she/it had worked/gone.

Before, after, until,  
as soon as, when, before 1997



CONTINUOUS

Had + been + infinitive + - ing

I/you/we/they had  
been working.  
He/she/it had been working.

Long time before you came,  
for 3 years before



## PRESENT PERFECT

SIMPLE

Have / has + p.p.

I/you/we/they have  
worked/gone.  
He/she/it has worked/gone.

Yet, since, already, up to now,  
for 2 years, recently, just,  
ever / never, lately



CONTINUOUS

Have/has + been +  
infinitive + - ing

I/you/we/they have been  
working.  
He/she/it has been working.

Not yet, since March,  
already, up to now, since,  
lately, recently



## FUTURE PERFECT

SIMPLE

Will / shall + have + p.p.

I/you/we/they will have  
worked/gone.  
He/she/it will have worked/gone.

By tomorrow



CONTINUOUS

Will / shall + have been + infinitive + - ing

I/you/we/they will have been  
working.  
He/she/it will have been working.

By tomorrow, by next day



p.p. = past participle
